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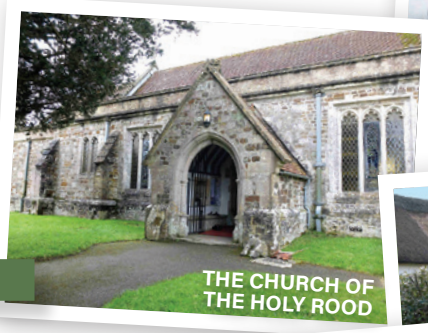
Our picturesque village lies between the river Frome and a ridge of hills separating it from the popular resort of Lulworth on Dorset's Jurassic Coast.

Although there's an abundance of pastureland on all sides of the village, the name 'Wool' has nothing to do with sheep farming - it derives from the Saxon 'Wyllon' signifying a well or spring. Water from the spring continues to tumble off the chalk ridge, forming a picturesque stream as it flows past thatched cottages in Spring Street and across water meadows to join the river Frome.

Woolbridge is the name given to the ancient crossing point on the Frome, and the present 5-arch bridge dates from the 16th Century. Following the construction of a new bridge to take motor vehicles, Woolbridge has become a tranquil vantage point for walkers and cyclists to enjoy views of the river and surrounding countryside.

Standing alongside the bridge is Woolbridge Manor (not open to the public). This imposing 17th-Century manor house is famous as the fictional setting for the ill-fated honeymoon of Angel Clare and Tess in Thomas Hardy's novel 'Tess of the D'Urbervilles'. Wool's village hall in Colliers Lane is named after the D'Urberville family and is the venue for a Country Market every Thursday morning where you can buy local produce.

In the 12th Century, a Cistercian Abbey was established at Bindon on the eastern edge of the village. What little remains of the Abbey is sufficient to form an impression of the vast scale of the site. Amongst the ruins there's an open tomb which was used by Angel Clare to lay Tess in after he carried her from Woolbridge House. Today, the Abbey grounds are privately owned but are opened to the public on certain days for charity and are well worth a visit.



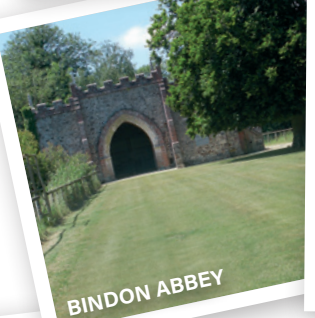

SPRING STREET COTTAGES

The ancient craft of weaving hurdles from coppiced hazel is still practised in Wool, materials being sourced from plantations near the village. Hurdles were traditionally used as temporary fencing for sheep, but these days they are more likely to be used as decorative garden features.

The railway arrived in Wool in 1847, but sadly the main station building was demolished in 1969 and replaced by the prefabricated structure you see today. All that remains of the old station is the small goods shed next to the car park. A branch line to the army camp at Bovington was constructed just after World War I, but the track had been lifted long before the beginning of WWII! A railway bridge abutment on the river bank, clearly visible from Woolbridge, is the only clue that the line ever existed.

The nuclear energy facility to the west of the village at Winfrith is in the process of being decommissioned, after which most of the site will revert to heathland. However, Wool makes a significant contribution to the renewable energy market, with a large solar farm to the north of the river Frome and an archimedes - screw turbine which harnesses the power of the river at Bindon Abbey.

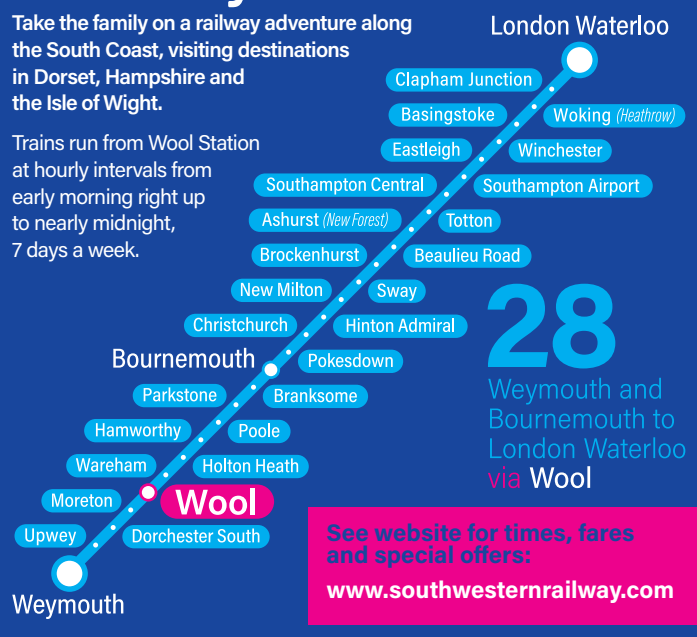
7 Lulworth Cove & Durdle Door

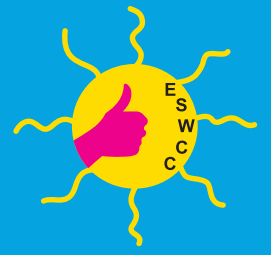

Wool (NCN2) Cycle Routes & Trails

The cycle route NCN2 runs along the south coast of England and passes through Wool via East Burton Road, Wool level crossing and Bindon Lane.

There is a signposted, off-road cycle/footpath from Wool Station to Bovington, passing the Tank Museum entrance.

Another signposted cycle route runs between Wool Station and Dorset Innovation Park, just to the west of the village.

From Bovington Tank Museum you can follow the circular Lawrence of Arabia Trail, taking in T.E. Lawrence's cottage at Clouds Hill, the site of his fatal motorbike crash and his final resting place at Moreton.

A medium-distance trail, signposted Purbeck Way West Route, follows the east-west ridge passing through picturesque Coombe Keynes village, which is about 2 miles south of Wool.

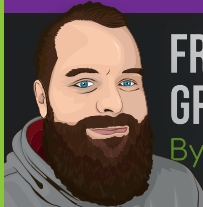

WALK 1
WOOLBRIDGE & RIVER FROME
From the railway crossing gates, head towards the river following signposts to Bovington. Either continue over Woolbridge, passing Woolbridge Manor and the solar farm before returning the same way. Otherwise go down the steps to the river bank and follow the footpath to the field boundary, where you can turn left and wander back into the village.

WALKING AROUND WOOL
There are many interesting walks around Wool, either off-road across meadows & fields or along country lanes. Just follow the many signposts. Please keep your dog on a lead near livestock.

WALK 2
VILLAGE COTTAGES
A short circular walk around Spring Street and High Street will take in most of the historic 'cob and thatch' cottages in Wool village.

WALK 3
WOODSTREET & COLE WOOD
For a longer circular walk, from Spring Street cross the stream into Church Lane and visit the 14th Century parish church. From the far end of Church Lane, follow the footpath signposted 'Woodstreet'. Continue across the fields until you reach a country lane. Turn left along the lane, then turn left again into Cole Wood and follow signposts back to Wool. The abandoned settlement of Woodstreet is further along the lane at the foot of the hill.

ASK THE LOCALS
Upton Country Park is great day out as it's so easy to reach by bus or train, with the south-west entrance close to Hamworth Station. Plus it's free to get in! We love the woodland walks with glimpses across Poole harbour and always enjoy watching water fowl from the bird hide. There's also a children's play park, a walled botanic garden and a café serving scrumptious cakes!
